WELCOME AND OUTLINE OF MEETING

Welcome from Caryl Haf, and outline of points that will be discussed in this extraordinary council in relation to hosting the Young People's Village this year. She thanked all who took part in the survey, and those who promoted it within their counties. Meeting is handed over to Iwan Meirion and Claire Powell to discuss the budget available for YPV.

BUDGET FOR YPV

Iwan opened thanking both Claire and Phil for their hard work in researching members' opinions on YPV. Findings from the survey suggest that members would like the YPV to be simplified, to strip the large costs that have been allocated over the previous years, and start once again by building it back up to how it used to be.

The budget was then shared, and discussed with those present.

Topics were then presented to those present to vote. Results as follows:

 Council to approve the proposal - 2022 YPV is open to YFC Members only aged 16 -17 years

29 resonses. 82.9% voted in Favour. 17.24% Voted against.

Confirmed 2022 will be open for members who are 16 & 17 years old.

Following this question, the wording for the second question was revisited for clarity. It was put forward by Aled Thomas to change the wording, and seconded by Rhian. The wording was changed to the following:

2. Council to approve that at least 50 percent of each group accommodation booking aged 18 years and over are YFC Member for 2022 YPV.

32 responded. 59.37% Voted in Favour. 37.5% Voted against. 3.12% Abstained.

Confirmed that all plot bookings for over 18s need to be 50% members of YFC.

3. Council to approve that YFC Members only 18 years and over can purchase a ticket to attend the Entertainment arena.

30 responded. 26.66% Voted in favour. 70% voted against. 3.33% Abstained.

Confirmed that Entertainment Arena will be open for anyone over the age of 18. 16-17 year olds will need to be members.

4. Council to approve that the 12 hour pass for the campsite must physically be a YFC Member.

31 responded. 96.77% Voted in Favour. 3.22% Voted against.

Confirmed that no non-members are to be sold a 12 hour pass for the campsite.

EM/33/2022 ANY OTHER BUSINESS

Iwan Meirion confirmed Finance and Management will re-visit some budget proposals, specifically the budget for entertainment as it was suggested by Mared Jones, Tom Bevan and Katie Miles that 5k is too little for the week.
