## C/64/2022 CORRESPONDENCE

Information has been received regarding a pilot Stock Judging competition with the Five Nations that will be held at the Highland show. Wales YFC are able to send forward 3 members to compete. The committee agreed that the top three from Wales YFC Field Day senior Stockman competition would be asked to go forward.

A letter has been received from Meirionnydd. The letter noted their concerns that there is not a Cerdd Dant competition in the Eisteddfod 2022. They also noted that the Wales YFC entry closing date is before their county Eisteddfod.

After discussion, the committee decided to extend the closing date to the 7<sup>th</sup> November as several other counties had the same issues.

In terms of the Cerdd Dant, it was proposed that the host county get to decide what competitions are in the Eisteddfod programme.

## C/65/2022 TO RECEIVE FEEDBACK ON THE EISTEDDFOD VENUE RULE

Caryl informed the committee on discussions that ware taken place in the Finance and Management committee. It was noted that it was discussed at the Council meeting that

took place 14<sup>th</sup> July 2020. It was also discussed in the competitions meeting prior to this, which there were ten county federations present.

Caryl noted that Claire is currently working on budget and would be in a position to share those within 7-10 days.

Concerns were raised from several committee members regarding the time this decision was made and that most counties were not meeting in July 2020 due to COVID restrictions.

It was strongly felt, if counties are able to host the Eisteddfod within their counties, Wales YFC should support this.

It was agreed that the competitions committee is to write a letter to finance and management committee to ask for the current decision is changed and that Wales YFC support counties to host the Eisteddfod in their own county pending they are able to make it financially successful. The three set venues should be kept as backup in case a county does have a suitable location.

# C/66/2022 TO REVIEW FESTIVAL OF PUBLIC SPEAKING

A report of the day was shared on screen and Sian talked the committee through it.

Counties agreed that an earlier results ceremony for the morning competition should be done due to young members travelling a long distance.

Points were raised regarding the Senior Member of Year competition. It was noted that the judges asked competitors to keep their answers short. Sian apologised for this.

Disappointment was raised regarding the Welsh After Dinner Speaking as one county pulled out last minute. It felt that the other county at that dinner didn't have the best chance to respond.

It was noted that the room where the results was shared was a little small for the amount of people there.

For future competition it was raised that we avoid celebrations day such as Mother's Day or Cardiff Half Marathon. Sian asked that counties discuss if a Saturday or Sunday would suit competitors better.

The committee decided that the Welsh Senior topics should be released four weeks prior to the competition to be in line with the English section.

It was decided to add a question in the Junior Member of the Year form to ask if they require laptop/projector etc.

Some members would wish to know the full results for the Senior and Junior member of the year competition. Sian asked that the committee take it back to county level for all opinions.
