I/15/2022 CHAIRMAN'S WELCOME & INTRODUCTIONS

In opening the meeting, Chairman Nerys Lewis reminded the committee that the meeting would be recorded for minute taking purposes. The committee members introduced themselves and outlined the exchanges that they had been on previously as well as the trips that they currently hold a place on.

I/17/2022 TO CONFIRM THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING

I/19/2022 CORRESPONDENCE

One piece of correspondence was received from Finland. The chairman asked if this could be discussed under point 20, the committee agreed.

I/20/2022 Confirm 2022 International Programme

Rhianwen had been on contact with partner countries and organisations that we are due to travel with. Some of the trips in 2022 still have spaces available that we will look to fill in the coming months.

The current 2022 programme stands as follows:

- Rural affairs agreed itinerary for the AGRII trip in 2022. Two spaces are still open for members to apply for. It was agreed to run over three weekends with locations still to be confirmed.
- Two spaces are still available on the interrailing trip, and it is currently going ahead as planned.
- An email was sent to all members who had been offered a place on the Isle of Man trip highlighting the option to attend the winter ball rather than travelling in the summer. Two members replied confirming that they

were happy to travel in the winter, four replied showing their wish to travel in the summer. A vote was held, and the majority of committee voted to hold trip next summer rather than the alternative dates of November 2021.

- We received two dates to start the Safari and it was agreed that heading out on the 21st august 2022. Rhianwen has been in contact with Contiki, and they have confirmed that the dates and price are to stay the same. Due to changes in circumstance three spaces are now available and will be readvertised. Iestyn mentioned that deposits are needed for spaces to be confirmed.
- It was agreed to keep the sailing trip as an under 18's trip.
- Scotland have confirmed that they will not be making a decision on hosting in 2022 until January
- The Elwyn Jones Scholarship has been readvertised to members.
- Study session 1 member (waiting further details from Rural Youth Europe)
- Ulster have confirmed that they will be making a decision later in the week on 2022 exchanges.
- We received correspondence from Finland that confirmed that they have postponed the exchange in 2022 but look forward to hosting again in 2023.
- European Rally (Germany 30th July 6th August 2022) 1 position available
- Autumn Seminar (Ireland November 2022) 1 position available
- We are yet to hear back from Canada on whether or not they are going to be taking part in the exchange in 2022.
- We received feedback from the co-ordinator of the USA (Colorado/Montana) exchange. They have requested that when they send members over on exchange then they would spend a minimum of 2 weeks with each host. They would look to send exchangees for between 3 and 6 months each with a possibility of sending 4 exchangees each year. The committee understood the reasoning behind the requests but it was suggested that we offered to host 1 this year to understand the best way to host for a long time frame with the option to host more in future years when other nations in the UK are back hosting exchangees.
 This year to be confirmed what time of year they will be coming to Wales.

It is yet to be confirmed what time of year they will be coming to Wales. It was suggested that we look to bring in a ruling that in order to gain a place on each exchange, the candidate should have hosted previously. It was also suggested that those looking to go on the America trips would host on the return leg.

It was felt that further conversations were needed to be had within counties prior to a decision being made

Selection interviews to be held on Sunday 9th January 2022. Interviews to be held in person providing restrictions allow, with the option of hybrid interviews should candidates not be able to attend due to illness / Covid.

The Committee was happy for the chair to look over the program prior to going out.

I/21/2022 TO CONFIRM THE 2023 INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMME

The committee discussed the direction the 2023 International programme will go in at length. It was agreed to postpone the ski trip to January 2023 as it was felt to be safer than holding in 2022. With things now being so uncertain it was thought that we would get a better uptake in 2023.

It was suggested to look into weeklong trips as a maximum time frame rather than the long-haul trips previously looked at. It was felt that this length of trip would appeal to the larger grass root membership. The committee also asked to investigate trips with an Agri element.

Other Countries that were suggested to look into were:

- Ireland
- Netherlands
- Estonia
- Switzerland

Action Point 6: Wales YFC to look at these countries to see if trips were possible.
